The one writing is a deacon in the church that Bishop Hasugian pioneered and pastors till this day. He is the head of this fellowship of churches in Indonesia. They have churches in all of the regions, the headquarters being in North Sumatra, the province just south of Aceh. The title Pak means a revered one. An elder. One who is loved and respected.

So Nias Island (Gunung Sitoli) one of the victim Tsunami Aceh - North Sumatra 236 persons were die in Nias Beside that some victims moved to Riau Province (to Sidalu - dalu, Gelombang and Ujung Batu villages).

of Nias Island and South East Aceh) Please you reply soon this letter
